Transparency International-USA (TI-USA) is the US chapter of Transparency International, the leading NGO committed to curbing bribery and extortion in international business and development. TI-USA works in cooperation with the TI network of over 90 national chapters around the world to raise awareness about the cost of corruption and to promote comprehensive and effective institutional and legal reforms by governments, international organizations,(e.g., The World Bank), and corporations. We are 1 block from the McPherson Square Metro Station on the orange line, and 3 blocks from the Farragut North Metro Station on the red line. TI-USA is accepting applications for interns in Washington, D.C. Interns engage in a range of activities directly related to the chapter's anti-corruption agenda, including research, meeting/hearing attendance, media coverage, communications and general administration.

Candidates must have strong research, writing, and problem-solving skills. Also valuable:

- Professional or educational experience in international affairs or issues related to corruption & accountability
- Previous experience in a professional office environment
- Foreign language skills (especially Spanish)
- IT troubleshooting
- A passion for fighting corruption at home and abroad

Internships provide a unique opportunity to learn about the workings of a global advocacy group, the legal parameters of international trade and finance, and related aspects of international development aid.

Hours/Scheduling

Interns typically work between 20-40 hours a week during a 10-to-16 week internship period.

Stipend

This is an unpaid internship with interns receiving a modest stipend for local transportation expenses.

Deadlines

- For Fall Internships (Sept.-Dec.): July 31
- For Winter/Spring Internships (Jan.-May): December 15
- For Summer Internships (June-Aug.): April 15

Application Procedures

Interested junior/senior year undergrads or graduate students should submit:

1. one-page cover letter describing interest in the internship and availability for a full- or part-time schedule
2. resume
3. one-page writing sample
4. one-page list of references
