Lisa Alfred is Director of Administration responsible for all of TI-USA's office operations.

She is an experienced project manager and human resources expert. She studied Human Rights and International Relations at the University of Denver's Graduate School of International Studies from 1987-1989. She obtained her B.A in Political Science from the University of New Orleans in 1987. Ms. Alfred's policy articles have been published on numerous occasions throughout the past decade. She is also highly active in community service organizations in the metropolitan District of Columbia area.

Prior to joining Transparency International, USA, Ms. Alfred worked as Deputy Director and Director of Finance and Operations at the Humanities Council of Washington, DC, where she oversaw all financial and accounting procedures of the office and established its centralized filing system. She also managed five full-time staff members and numerous contractors and vendors.

Ms. Alfred worked as a Legal Assistant for 5 years at Sonnenschien, Nath & Rosenthal in the Public Law and Policy Strategies Group; and Scribner Hall & Thompson. Additionally, she served for 7 years at Assets Resolution Ventures as Office Manager, where she performed extensive comparative financial analysis of the projects within the commercial portfolio.

Ms. Alfred's domestic and international experience is extensive. She served as Staff Director of the U.S. Senate Foreign Relations Committee- Subcommittee on African Affairs, where she provided guidance on matters relating to political nominations, treaties, and bilateral and multilateral African Issues. She also worked as a Legislative Assistant for TransAfrica, where she prepared lobbying platforms on Africa and the Caribbean, including coordinating the first Washington, DC visits of Nelson Mandela and the President of Angola. Additionally, Ms. Alfred worked as an independent project consultant for Human Rights Watch, OXFAM International, and the U.S. Committee for Refugees, and Africa Today (Journal of African Affairs).
